**STANTON-01-03 (Correction)**

- Q.** What is the number of year round residents to be displaced by each proposed route?
- A.** At the time the design was stopped on the original route under discussion, eight buildings were identified that were fully or partially in the proposed ROW. Had the design continued, there would have been up to five additional structures in this category. Three of these buildings are likely being occupied on a seasonal basis.

On the bypass route under discussion, there are five buildings that are fully or partially in the proposed ROW.
